J'**aperçois** au loin le Mont-Saint-Michel.

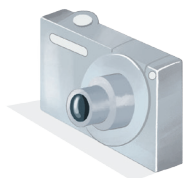
**apercevoir (s')**

call (to)

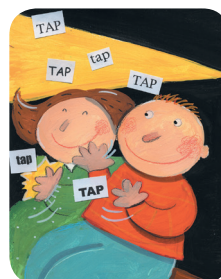
I'm **calling** my mum.

come near (to)

Don't **come near** me, I have a bad cold.

Ne **'approche** pas de moi, j'ai un gros rhume.

**appuyer**  
lean (to)

John **is leaning** his head on his hand.



Jean **appuie** sa tête sur sa main.

Thomas **has leant** his bicycle against the wall.

Thomas **a appuyé** sa bicyclette contre le mur.

He's **leaning** against the wall.

Il **s'appuie** contre le mur.

**après**  
after

I'll come see you **after** school.

Je passerai te voir **après** l'école.

**après-demain**  
the day after tomorrow
